- **Full payment** = Summer Processing Fee + Tuition + Materials Fee
- Multi-camp discount: Enroll in more than one camp/class/workshop and get 20% off the lesserpriced camps/classes/workshops. (Does not apply to private lessons. Discount is per student, not per family. Does not apply to tuition already discounted by financial aid.)

ENROLLMENT

Enrollment in all programs is limited. Registration is on a firstcome, first-served basis and must be secured by paying tuition and fees in full. The Music School reserves the right to cancel camps/classes/workshops due to insufficient enrollment.
